

Sophie von Dobschuetz is a veterinary epidemiologist with a PhD in Parasitology and International Animal Health from the Free University in Berlin, Germany and an MSc in Veterinary Epidemiology and Public Health from the Royal Veterinary College in London, UK. Since September 2022 she is WHO's Technical Lead for Middle East respiratory syndrome coronavirus (MERS-CoV) and other novel coronaviruses for the Emerging Diseases and Zoonoses team at WHO headquarters.

From 2004 to 2022 she has worked for the Animal Health Service of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) to support countries in early warning, early detection, and the prevention and control of infectious animal diseases, with a focus on zoonoses such as avian influenza, Rift Valley fever, Ebola, MERS-CoV and SARS-CoV-2. She also developed, alongside WHO and the World Organisation for Animal Health (WOAH), methodologies and tools for qualitative One Health risk assessment at the animal-human-environment interface.

As MERS-CoV Technical Lead for WHO, Dr von Dobschuetz supports countries in disease prevention and control, application of interdisciplinary and cross-cutting approaches, risk assessment and serves as unit focal point for inter-agency collaboration.
